## — REMEMBERING ANOTHER PAST GRAND MASTER —



We are all familiar with Most Worshipful Allen B. Gresham—Past Grand Master of Masons in California, who served as our Grand Master in 1996-1997. M.:W.: Gresham originally joined San Bernardino Lodge 348 and served as its Master in 1967. Lodge 348 later consolidated with San Bernardino 178 and took the lower number. In 1915, exactly 100 years ago, M.:W.: Benjamin Franklin Bledsoe, another member of Lodge 348, had also served as Grand Master in California. Like Allen M.:W.: Ben was an attorney. But unlike Allen, he was born in San Bernardino. His father was an attorney and young Ben attended San Bernardino High School; the same school that Friend Richardson—an early Governor of CA, as well as Paul Shoup—a President of the Southern Pacific Railroad, which was the largest land holder in CA. Ben attended the newly-established

Stanford University, where he graduated in 1896 at the age of 22. In those early times, rather than attend a formal Law School, it was not uncommon for one to simply work as an under-study to another attorney or judge and become qualified to take the State Bar Exam in that fashion. And so it was with Ben. He studied with his father, graduated from his studies at Stanford, passed the California State Bar and became an attorney. At first, Ben practiced with his father in the two-man firm of Bledsoe and Bledsoe, but after only four years of practice, he ran for Superior Court judge against the sitting judge who was seeking re-election. Despite being a significant underdog, young Ben was popular enough to tie the incumbent. The Supreme Court then ruled that Bledsoe should be awarded the office, and Ben became the Superior Court Judge for San Bernardino County.

At the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, San Bernardino was a fast-growing transportation hub and Phoenix Lodge 178 didn't seem to be enough. So, in 1902, San Bernardino Lodge 348 was formed. Ben was one of the first Masons raised in that Lodge; quickly joined the Officer's Line; then became Master in 1908. Ben seemed to be in a great hurry, and was appointed Grand Orator in 1909. President Woodrow Wilson appointed him to be a Federal District Court judge in Los Angeles—and the same day he was installed in that position, he was also installed Grand Master in CA for 1915. Next, he became Grand Commander of York Rite in 1920, and served on the judiciary Committee of the Knights of Pithias. He resigned as a federal judge in 1925 to run for Mayor of LA. Unsuccessful in that bid, he returned to the practice of law—but that did not end his civic activities. Ben served for many years on the Board of Directors of Forest Lawn Memorial Park and was instrumental in ensuring Chinese and Jewish people were permitted to be buried there. In 1938, while living in Crestline with his wife [of 39 years] Katherine, whom he married in 1899; Ben died at an early age of 64. He was probably worn out from running at top speed all of his life. Originally from Council Bluffs, Iowa, Katherine was also a Stanford graduate. She never married again; and lived another 26 years until her death in 1964. M.:W.: Bledsoe was an outstanding example of someone of truly exalted Masonic Character.

## CLINIC STAR OF THE MONTH

Joe-Aaden has been seen at this Clinic for six months working on language and articulation. He is a three (3) year, eight (8) months old boy who loves to play with all the Clinic toys and always seems to be curious about the “why” or “how come” of the toy; he is also curious about most of the materials in the Clinic room and very helpful about making sure things are put back in their places.

Over the last few months, our main focus has been the pizza he will be getting from his grandmother after speech, so— we must do the work so as to get to that pizza faster. Joe-Aaden is a playful worker. Stating “no way!” when things seem to surprise him, or “oh man” when things do not always go his way.

He is brought to his sessions by his very dedicated and loving grandmother, Deborah R., whom I have observed as open and willing to my suggestions for encouraging speech and language development. Deborah R. stated that Joe-Aaden has “come a long way, his vocabulary has increased, he is pointing out things, and he is initiating conversations. Before, he spoke one to two words and now he won’t stop talking.” She also reported that other family or neighbors who have not seen Joe-Aaden for weeks have even commented and noticed—saying “wow, we can understand him.” It has been my pleasure to work with Joe-Aaden. It fills my heart with joy to know his world is made bigger with words.

Prior to him receiving help by the CLC, there was a communication barrier between him and I. I had a difficult time understanding many of his words. Due to the barrier, many times I would tell him “show me what you want.”

With the help of Mrs. Jovi, I have noticed a significant change in Joe-Aaden’s speech (pronunciation) skill and these barrier are now seldom. Even at those times when there is a barrier, it is now easier to work through and correct his pronunciation. He has gone from difficulties with one word to speaking in complete sentences. I thank the CLC for all their effort and dedication to helping my son. Aside from the positive experience it has been for Joe-Aaden, it has also had a great impact on our family.

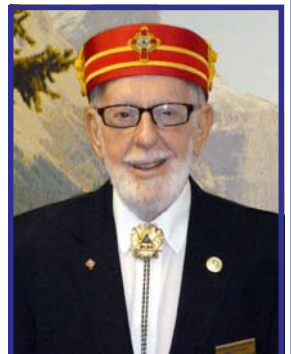

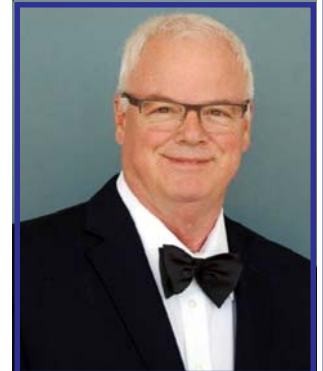

# SCOTTISH RITE MEMBERSHIP DRIVE!

The Valley of San Bernardino Scottish Rite has two Class Reunions each year; one in the Spring, and another in the Fall. Over the past three decades, a great number of our members who have passed away, have not replaced with new members. This has created an extreme shortage, and one that needs our immediate attention. Each member of our Valley has to do his part in order to help turn this deficit around. How can you help? Each member needs to take copies of our monthly Scottish Rite bulletins with them to their respective Blue Lodge to share with newly raised Master Masons. Also, each member needs to canvas his respective lodge for Scottish Rite members who have become inactive. Share what we do and give them an overview of various positions we have available that need filling. Then—entice these members to return—and get active.



**K**nights of St. Andrew (KSA) membership is open to all 32° [black hat] Masters of the Royal Secret. This prestigious unit is very active within our Valley, and its members can be found serving as officers within our four Bodies; on a variety of committees and teams, and often involved in special activities. The KSA are readily identified by their black wool Glengarry styled cap (similar to U.S. military overseas cap), bordered with black silk ribbon which surrounds entire cap at the bottom edge—extending upward by 1/4 inch, and joining at the back to form two strands of one inch wide ribbon that hangs down. There is a 1” diameter toorie (pompom or tuff) of red wool affixed to the top center of cap, and a KSA emblem pinned to the left side—centered toward the front of the cap. KSA members wear a blue plaid baldric (tartan) over their right shoulder, affixed at the left waist. The Current Chieftain (leader) is further identified by a gold badge and plumage (three feathers) attached to the left side of his wool cap; the Counselor (asst. leader) has a silver badge, and two feathers; and Past Chieftains (PC), have a gold breast badge with a lion and crown, and one feather. All other KSA members wear the silver badge on their cap. Past Members with KCCH Honours may also wear the blue baldric. Elected Officers include: Chieftain, Councilor, Treasurer, and Secretary. Appointed Officers include: Knight of the Watch, Knight Orator, Knight of Heraldry and Regalia, and Knight Sentinal. For further information, please contact Brother Lee Whelan, 32° KSA-PC. Bro.
